

English Literature (1-9)



Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th-century novel

What's assessed

Macbeth Jekyll and Hyde

- Shakespeare
- The 19th-century novel

How it's assessed

- written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes
- 64 marks
- 40% of GCSE

Questions

Section A Shakespeare: students will answer one question on their play of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole.

Section B The 19th-century novel: students will answer one question on their novel of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel and then to write about the novel as a whole.

Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry

What's assessed

An Inspector Calls Relationships Poetry

- Modern texts
- Poetry
- Unseen poetry

How it's assessed

- written exam: 2 hour 15 minutes
- 96 marks
- 60% of GCSE

Questions

Section A Modern texts: students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on their studied modern prose or drama text.

Section B Poetry: students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their chosen anthology cluster.

Section C Unseen poetry: Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.




- Higher tier students will sit exams from AQA



Making the grade

Each student requires at least 5 GCSE's with grades (A*-C) to access entry to courses in the Sixth Form.

- In order to take A Level courses each student will require a grade B either in this subject or a related one. (For A Level Maths this is a grade A).
- For BTEC courses a Merit is required. (Also GCSE Maths and/or English grade C are useful in some BTEC courses under the new specifications with controlled assessments introduced).
